

Criminal Investigator: Investigations – Syracuse

The Office of the Attorney General (OAG) is seeking qualified candidates for Investigator positions located in various locations in the State. Candidates should be hard-working, motivated and committed to public service on behalf of the people of the State of New York.

Investigators, under supervision, conduct detailed investigations of the circumstances, facts and conditions connected with complaints and violations of the law, using the highest level of independent judgment and discretion. These are often highly complex and sensitive criminal matters which cross county lines and involve organized crime.

This position performs investigations in a wide variety of criminal cases in various bureaus throughout the Office of the Attorney General in the Syracuse region. **The qualifications for this specific position include: Expertise and service as an expert court witness in the field of polygraph science; experience investigating financial crimes and money laundering; experience conducting surveillance operations; Division of Criminal Justice Certified Instructor; experience in interaction and coordination with other law enforcement agencies; and having law enforcement contacts in the Onondaga and surrounding counties area.**

Qualifications in addition to those listed above:

Must have at least ten years of law enforcement and current NYS basic police school certification.

Performance of the duties may require frequent, unscheduled work on evenings and weekends.
