

Deputy Chief Investigator: Organized Crime Task Force (OCTF) - White Plains

The Office of the Attorney General is seeking qualified candidates for Investigator positions located in various locations in the State. Candidates should be hard-working, motivated and committed to public service on behalf of the people of the State of New York.

The role of the OCTF is to conduct complex, long term investigations into various types of organized criminal activity. The majority of the Unit's investigations utilize advanced and specialized investigative techniques such as physical surveillance, court authorized eavesdropping of telephones, businesses, vehicles, and computers, as well as search warrants, which include the use of still and video photography. The nature of the investigations conducted by OCTF includes traditional organized crime - gambling, loan sharking, extortion, and narcotics, among others.

This position is responsible for the overall management and supervision of investigatory personnel in the Organized Crime Task Force, Upstate region.

The qualifications for this position are: Extensive experience supervising numerous investigators; case management experience; extensive experience in administration including hiring, evaluating, counseling and disciplining, and fiscal management; experience in internal investigations; extensive experience managing, conducting, planning and executing investigations incorporating physical surveillance, wiretaps, and other eavesdropping equipment; excellent verbal and written communication skills; and law enforcement contacts at the local, state and federal levels.

This position requires the ability to travel with little notice and be away for several days.

Qualifications in addition to those listed above:

Must have at least ten years of law enforcement and current NYS basic police school certification.

Must possess a valid NYS driver's license and have the ability to drive a motor vehicle.

The Public Officer's Law requires that police officers at the OAG be citizens of the United States and reside in New York State.

Performance of the duties may require frequent, unscheduled work on evenings and weekends.
