

Investigator: Sex Offender Management Bureau (SOMB) – Buffalo

The Office of the Attorney General is seeking qualified candidates for Investigator positions located in various locations in the State. Candidates should be hard-working, motivated and committed to public service on behalf of the people of the State of New York.

SOMB conducts civil litigation necessary to either commit dangerous sex offenders to institutions, or to enable the state to manage those offenders under supervision who are not in custody. In furtherance of that litigation, SOMB is routinely called upon to conduct detailed investigations into the underlying facts of an offender's crimes and into the offender's entire history. **The qualifications for this position are: Expertise in interviewing victims of sexual assault, especially the elderly, children and adults, and extensive experience interviewing perpetrators of sexual assaults; experience at the Detective level with a specialty in Sex Offenses; extensive experience testifying as a witness in courts in sexual abuse cases; experience tracking down unreported sexual assault victims; and, established contacts within the law enforcement community in the Western New York State area.**

Qualifications in addition to those listed above:

Must have at least ten years of law enforcement and current NYS basic police school certification.

Must possess a valid NYS driver's license and have the ability to drive a motor vehicle.

The Public Officer's Law requires that police officers at the OAG be citizens of the United States and reside in New York State.

Performance of the duties may require frequent, unscheduled work on evenings and weekends.
