

Chief Investigator: Investigations - New York City

The Office of the Attorney General (OAG) is seeking qualified candidates for the position of Chief Investigator. Candidates should be hard-working, motivated and committed to public service on behalf of the people of the State of New York.

The Chief Investigator is cognizant of all investigations undertaken by the OAG and is ultimately responsible for the direction of work and operations of all OAG investigators, statewide. The subject matter of the investigations includes public integrity, Medicaid fraud, auto insurance fraud, and organized crime, among others. The appointed person must be an individual in whom the Attorney General can place his complete trust and confidence.

The Chief Investigator is a senior-level position that ultimately reports to the Attorney General and is also under the direction of a Chief Deputy Attorney General, as well as the Executive Deputy Attorney General for Criminal Justice.

The qualifications for this specific position include: Extensive experience establishing policies and procedures for the conduct of investigations; extensive managerial experience in administration, including hiring, evaluating, counseling and disciplining; extensive managerial experience in budget formulation and fiscal management; experience in internal investigations of bureau staff; experience formulating training plans for investigative staff; high-level experience interacting with other law enforcement agencies, including local, state, and federal agencies; ability to oversee highly sensitive criminal and internal investigations. Performance of these duties requires 24/7 availability.

Qualifications in addition to those listed above:

- Bachelor's degree in Criminal Justice
- At least fifteen years of progressively responsible law enforcement experience including the management/supervision of a minimum of 150 officers.
- Current NYS basic police school certification.
- Knowledge of NYS laws relating to evidence, criminal procedures, etc.
- Must possess a valid NYS driver's license and have the ability to drive a motor vehicle.
- The Public Officer's Law requires that police officers at the OAG be citizens of the United States and reside in New York State.

Performance of the duties may require frequent, unscheduled work on evenings and weekends.
