

Investigator: Medicaid Fraud Control Unit (MFCU) - Buffalo

The Office of the Attorney General is seeking qualified candidates for Investigator positions located in various locations in the State. Candidates should be hard-working, motivated and committed to public service on behalf of the people of the State of New York.

MFCU, the centerpiece of New York's efforts to combat Medicaid provider fraud, is looking for experienced investigators to conduct complex investigations into fraud committed by Medicaid providers and others in the healthcare industry who steal from New York State, those involved in the diversion of prescription narcotics, and to investigate and prosecute abuse and neglect of residents in nursing homes, hospitals, and other residential healthcare facilities.

The qualifications for this position are: Experience in all aspects of narcotics investigations including the use of informants, electronic surveillance, standard surveillance, search warrants, expert testimony, witness testimony and depositions; experience with the coordination of other local, state and federal law enforcement to include participation in wiretap surveillance cases and multi-defendant warrant roundups; experience in assets forfeiture case documentation; investigation of welfare applications for validity of information; and extensive law enforcement contacts on the local, state and federal levels in the Buffalo area. Associate's or Bachelor's Degree in Criminal Justice preferred.

Qualifications in addition to those listed above:

Must have at least ten years of law enforcement and current NYS basic police school certification.

Must possess a valid NYS driver's license and have the ability to drive a motor vehicle.

Performance of the duties may require frequent, unscheduled work on evenings and weekends.
