The Public Health Administration Section of the [Litigation Bureau](#) in the Office of the New York State Attorney General is seeking an experienced litigator to serve in the New York City office. The Litigation Bureau represents the State of New York and its agencies and officers in state and federal courts in legal actions and proceedings relating to civil rights, education, social services, public employment, public health, law enforcement, corrections, state finance, insurance, taxation, and other litigated matters arising out of state operations and legislation.

Attorneys assigned to the Public Health Administration Section primarily represent the Department of Health, Office of the Medicaid Inspector General, Board for Professional Medical Conduct, and the Education Department's Office of Professional Discipline. The Section's attorneys defend a wide variety of state and federal court actions involving, among other things, the regulation of Medicaid health care providers, state public health law requirements, disciplinary proceedings against physicians and other medical professionals for misconduct, criminal background checks for home care providers, and employment and civil rights issues. The Section's cases present a myriad of questions on constitutional law and statutory/regulatory interpretation, including matters of first impression, and generally have significant financial and policy implications for the State. Attorneys are responsible for all phases of litigation through trial, including appellate division review in professional disciplinary matters, and have frequent opportunities to present written and oral arguments in court.

The ideal candidate has at least five (5) years of federal and/or state court civil litigation experience; however, a minimum of two (2) years civil litigation experience (including clerkships) is required. Superior writing, analytic and organizational skills are also required.

Applicants must reside in (or intend to soon become a resident of) New York State and be admitted to practice law in New York State. In addition, the Public Officers Law requires that OAG attorneys be citizens of the United States.

Candidates from diverse backgrounds are encouraged to apply.
